UCalgary students attend inspirational address from former first lady Michelle Obama

Growing seeds of change and inspiring our youth

"To our young people: We're counting on you and we believe in you ... We have more to learn from you about resilience, persistence and honesty and inclusion. I can't wait to see what you all will do. And I know the adults in this room will be there hopefully to support you every step of the way. I know I will." — former first lady Michelle Obama

Messages of resilience, women and youth empowerment, and the power of hope were key themes at An Evening with Michelle Obama — a keynote address from the former first lady last week in Calgary.

Fifty tickets were donated to UCalgary students, thanks to a generous group of donors led by University of Calgary Chancellor Emerita Joanne Cuthbertson. Students committed to volunteerism and community service were entered in a draw for a ticket to attend the special event. All participants in the draw were current full-time students at the university and were selected randomly beginning March 15, until all 50 tickets were

"I thought the event was absolutely amazing. As a young woman who has many dreams, hearing Michelle Obama speak about her journey was very inspirational," says Manpreet Deol, Schulich Leader National Scholarship recipient, and third-year mechanical and biomedical engineering student. "I am so thankful to the donors — it was a privilege to attend this event."

A donation of 10 tickets to the Faculty of Law paved the way for members of the Calgary Women Studying Law Association (CWSLA) to attend the Michelle Obama event. The CWSLA works to promote and support women entering the legal profession, so attending the event and hearing about Michelle Obama's work in law prior to her work with the White House was particularly poignant.
